
Fleets' origins display both legacy and current alignments of the region with China/Russia vs Europe/US, with Chinese fleet size dominating the region

- Pakistan lead both countries to renew their respectively MiG-29 and J-7 / Mirage III fighter fleets
- India also considers the Chinese threat and is still willing to fulfil the Multi-Role Fighter Aircraft tender for ~110 fighter aircraft. Already integrated in the forces, Dassault's Rafale holds a head start in the contest, and August 2025 reveals announced a future direct deal at state level by the end of 2025.
- Japan is currently receiving their first F-35Bs and considers committing more to the program amid UK & Italy's lack of urgency into the Tempest programme.
- Facing strong pressure from China, **Taiwan** expects to receive their last batch of 10 F-16 by the end of 2025, concluding a 66 aircraft order.
